



2012-2016 Program Plan Targets

#1: Increase parent awareness in gifted education events and procedures, measured by a 10% improved attendance rate at GATE events by 2016, evidenced by signed parent attendance sheets.

- #2: Increase number of identified FARM students by 10% by 2016.
- #3: Tier III Math gifted students will improve state Math test "advanced" scores from 50% to 70%.

Tier III Language Arts gifted students will improve state Reading test "advanced" scores from 26% to 45%.

#4: Tier III Math gifted students will improve TCAP Math median growth percentile from 43 to 52.

Tier III Language Arts & Math gifted students will improve CSAP Math median growth percentile from 45 5o 54.

#5: By 2016, 100% of Tier III elementary students will have a portfolio which includes a body of evidence demonstrating gifted student growth in area of identification

#6: By 2016, all schools will have UIP goals addressing gifted student achievement and growth.

#7: District classroom teachers will increase effective use of differentiated instructional methods by 20%, as evidenced by teacher year-end surveys, and as evidenced by gifted student achievement on state testing.

#8: Maintain current district supplement to support gifted education program goals and gifted student academic, social, and emotional needs.

#9: Maintain and sustain current record keeping practices.
