



2019-2020 GATE Population Separated by Area of Giftedness (%)



Looking Back >>> 2018-2019 Accomplishments

- Invited Depth and Complexity trainer to Cañon City Schools Annual Professional Development Fair
- Held annual Educate GATE! Night (speaker Jenny Hecht) with over 200 in attendance
- Attended Digging into Curiosity with Ian Byrd training as a department
- Attend the Secondary Gifted Education Collaborative Discussion Carter and Christiansen
- Attended the Writing Standard-aligned Advanced Learning Plans Workshop as a department
- Attended the Beyond Giftedness Conference
- Attended the Underachievement Workshop as a department
- Continued to build "relationship" with the Pikes Peak Region and helped facilitate TIPP (Talent Identification for the Pikes Peak Region) and Cañon City Schools sent two students to be adjudicated
- Held high school overnight college visits to CU Boulder, Colorado State University, Colorado School of Mines, and University of Colorado Springs along with a separate college visit to Western State Colorado University
- Added a 1st-3rd grade field trip to the Pueblo Raptor Center
- Continued with a 4th grade Jeep Tour field trip to explore Red Canyon
- Added a 5th grade field trip to Garden of the Gods and Space Museum
- Added a ropes course field trip for all 8th grade GATE students
- Added a middle school field trip to Skate City for STEM activities
- Continued high school trip to CU Boulder Fiske Planetarium and Rocky Mountain College for Art & Design
- Gifted Specialists continue to collaborate with general education staff on a regular basis
- Gifted parenting tips shared on an ongoing basis through GATE Quarterly and school newsletters
- Gifted teaching tips on The Happiness Advantage shared on an ongoing basis through emails to all staff members
- Continued implementation of Standard-aligned Advanced Learning Plans
- SPLASh was a big success again this year with 12 highly qualified teachers and over 150 students involved
- Sponsored a strong Middle School District Spelling Bee, Middle School Geography Bee, Math Counts, and District Elementary Science Fair
- Trisha Konty was recognized at the Alpha Delta Kappa Sorority Teacher of the Month
- Held second live jury for music identification and art identification
- Held afterschool Art Enrichment Club
- Updated GATE website monthly and department Facebook posts regularly
