Welding Program

The Pueblo Community College / Cañon City High School Welding Program was established in 2016. Since 2016 the Welding Program has had over 500 students participating in courses ranging from Oxy Acetylene Cutting Process (OFC), Plasma Arc Cutting Process (PAC), Shielded Metal Arc Welding (SMAW), Gas metal Arc Welding (GMAW), Layout & Fabrication to blueprint Reading for Welders.

We have awarded over 1,000 college credits earned through the Welding Technology Program, saving students over \$200,000. Eight students have received their AAS (Associates of Applied Science) in Welding Technology since leaving the welding program @ CCHS. 2022 will be a first for the welding program, as Dana Watters will be the first female from this program to matriculate to the campus in Pueblo to earn her AAS degree in Welding Technology.

Our SkillsUSA Welding Club has produced one state champion, one silver medalist & one bronze medalist. Our club has done numerous community service projects for Fremont County. Just to name a few; fabricating crosses for unmarked graves & flagpole holders for veterans @ the historical Greenwood Cemetery, fabricated (48) metal tables for 4H Fremont County small animal barn & removed all the dead Juniper bushes in front and on the side of Star Country 104.5.

ENGINEERING AND DESIGN

Engineering and Design students are working hard and closing out the semester in a positive way. Developing employable skills as well as college readiness is a challenge that these students take on very well. Juniors have finished designing their own house based on code specific requirements and architectural design concepts. Now, they are working on the application of structural mechanics concepts. Seniors have designed, built, and analyzed stress loads on prototype bridges. Now they are completing senior projects. These projects are either architectural or mechanical in nature and represent examples from the national competition students in these courses tend to dominate. Unfortunately, ADDA has ended their national competition program - largely because there were rarely winners from outside of CCHC. Jared Abels and Dimitri Zamarripa designed the class sign for the Class of 2022. Seniors have also been employed to design and present plans for the proposed innovation lab that will be constructed in Red Hallway beginning this school year.
