AÑON CITY

During the last week of November, the counseling team will be in classrooms for a 2nd quarter lesson. The focus of the lesson will be on dialectic thinking, which is a method of examining and discussing opposing perspectives in order to find a synthesis. This means that your student will practice understanding the perspectives of others, so that they can be more empathetic towards other individuals and more understanding when they are in conflict. Your student will also get to see how to recognize the values that are important to them and others, so that they can make decisions that honor their values, and consider the values of others.

CAREER AND TECH ED.

The Pueblo Community College / Canon City High School Automotive Program was established in 2008. Since 2008 the Auto Program has had over 900 students participating in courses ranging from basic automotive maintenance to more advanced topics including electrical circuits and vehicle driveability issues.

We have awarded approximately 7,750 college credits including the first associates degree before earning a High School diploma at CCHS. Our students can partner with numerous industry providers to earn additional training certificates. The Partners include: Ford ACE, Subaru-U,S/P2, Tomorrow's Tech University and many more. We were nominated for the Automotive School of the Year in 2018. We ended up in the top 5 in the nation.

P-TECH

Is your Freshman or Sophomore student interested in a career as an Automotive Technician, Advanced EMT, Firefighter,or Computer Information Systems IT Manager?

Then your student should consider joining PTECH. PTECH is a career readiness program that offers students the opportunity to earn their associate's degree in one of those four areas free of cost!

Students will begin working on their associate's degree while they are in high school and they have up to two years after high school to complete their degree at no cost. Highly motivated students also have the potential to finish their associate's while still in high school.
